Anniversary!

The 5th of July is a joyful occasion for me each year. It is the anniversary of my being ordained a priest. 32 years of priesthood is a relatively brief moment in time passing quickly, yet filled so deeply with God's grace. To celebrate the Mass is a privilege, a task entrusted to the priest to engage with in a reverent and humble way. The altar is a place of sanctity, an encounter with the Living God, a breath from heaven, gently ever so gently, "Love" (the love of Christ all consuming) is revealed, and hope (the hope for heaven) is offered. The Mass is the very heart and centre of priestly life, for it is here that Christ is truly present. Christ IS the priesthood. Christ is present to me now, as he was when he first called me into being, a mystery of relationship, one that accompanies my journey throughout the priesthood. I am a priest, not because I am the best person for the job, rather because Christ has chosen and called me to be a priest. Thank you for your prayers, understanding, love and support. Fr Patrick

Announcing freedom to the prisoners: Kazimerz Symanski of Poland was a prisoner of war during World War II. There is no record of what happened to Symanski in the prison camp, but his experiences there obviously changed him. In his later years, Symanski seemed bent on reliving his prison experience. He even turned his small apartment into a prison cell. He put bars over the windows and constructed a small cage in which he slept. He refused to allow electricity or running water in his apartment. He seemed determined to live in the most primitive and confining conditions. Symanski died in 1993 from the effects of his living conditions. (Oswald Chambers in "The Moral Foundations of Life" Christianity Today, Vol. 32, #13.) — Some of us, too, have been living for years in prison cells of our own making. We are bound by addictions, anxiety, low selfesteem, anger, fear, guilt, misconceptions about God. Jesus proclaims in today's Gospel that he came to liberate all such prisoners.

Following the visitations last year of all the parishes in our deanery by the diocese, we have been encouraged to form a joint Parish Council for our own parishes at Holy Family, St Francis and Our Lady of the Sacred Heart. It will be helpful to plan ways of working together in our parishes.

Monitoring of health and safety statutory compliance with testing of parish buildings.

(Updated) For your information: A diocesan report is being asked to be prepared by parishes on all buildings, regarding general risk assessment with emphasis upon managing risk.

Holy Family: Risk assessment is carried out quarterly. Fire risk once a year. No issues with asbestos. Electrical inspection carried out once a year. Gas twice a year. Tree safety regularly checked and the water has been checked with no legionella. **Bedworth:** A general risk assessment has been carried out to meet with H/S standards. Fire and Gas safety certificates are in place. A legionella test is to be done. Electricity certificates in place for church and house, but not the hall. Tree safety to be carried out in the next month; one tree has been vandalised with the bark hacked off, so more security may be needed at the back of the grounds by the church. Asbestos has been checked and no trace found. **Bulkington**: A general risk assessment has been done. We are looking at main access in church for disabled access in future. Fire certificates are in place Gas and electrics have been tested. Legionella to be tested. Trees and grounds in good order. Asbestos has been checked again none found. <u>Any queries please let Mary know.</u>

"It is some sort of cake!" The following story narrated by Anthony de Mello in his book, The Song of the Bird, illustrates poignantly the irony contained in today's Gospel reading (Mk 6:1-6). Nasruddin earned his living selling eggs. Someone came to his shop one day and said, "Guess what I have in my hand." "Give me a clue," said Nasruddin. "I shall give you several: It has the shape of an egg, the size of an egg. It looks like an egg, tastes like an egg, and smells like an egg. Inside it is yellow and white. It is liquid before it is cooked, becomes thick when heated. It was, moreover, laid by a hen." "Aha! I know!" said Nasruddin. "It is some sort of cake!" — It is ironic. The expert misses the obvious. And it was also an irony that the neighbours of Jesus of Nazareth missed the obvious., for they thought they knew every detail about "the carpenter's son." In purporting to have complete knowledge of Jesus' personal data, they ended up showing their ignorance. Their knowledge of "the carpenter, the son of Mary" was superficial. Their prejudice prevented them from believing and responding to the Christ, the Son of God
